

- ✓ A General Exemption allows people without a radiation user licence (e.g. students) to do radiation work under the supervision of a licenced person.
 - ✓ A General Exemption can only be issued by a person with a **General Approval to Exempt from Licensing (GE1)** condition on their radiation user licence.
 - ✓ If the general exemption issuer is *not* in a position to directly supervise, or they *do not* have a licence condition that matches the work being performed (e.g. IA14 for medical diagnostic radiography), they must ensure that the person is appropriately supervised by another licensee who is on-site and has licence condition that match the work being performed.
