Grant information

- The grants range in value from \$2000 and are capped at a maximum of \$10,000 per student
- Grants are for accommodation related expenses only
- The full grant will be administered by the tertiary institution as a stipend payment into the student's nominated bank account.

Grant terms and conditions

Students must agree to the Guidelines (this document) and complete the application form which includes proof of:

- Student must be Aboriginal
- Proof of age (16 Years of older)
- Student must be enrolled in a full time, on campus degree course or recognised University bridging pathways course
- Applicants must provide evidence that they are a social housing tenant or experiencing housing stress (housing stress is defined as an individual expending more than 40% of weekly income on housing)
- Students must provide evidence of independent living (forms of evidence below)
- Students must provide proof of income
- Students must provide a 'Statement of Claim' (see application form for further details)
- Students must provide referees.

Student obligations

- Students will be required to provide evidence on an independent living arrangement
- Students intending on leaving or differing will need to provide this information in writing to the grant management section of their institute
- Students may be required to provide receipts to acquit the grant funds, (upon request only)
- Students are required to participate in a pre and post survey.

Program constraints

- The grants are capped at up to \$10,000 per student
- The grants are for Aboriginal students enrolled in full time studies only, with a minimum duration of three years, or an accredited University bridging pathways program.
