

HDR Minimum Resources Statement

All higher degree by research (HDR) candidates should have minimum access to certain resources to undertake their research and complete their research training. At Charles Sturt University, we recognise that such resources must be available to HDR candidates to fulfil the University's commitment to creating an environment conducive to high-quality and productive research and research training.

The University also acknowledges that some HDR research projects require additional resources. In these cases, the funding source for these additional resources must be identified (and stated) before the candidate is admitted. The University also provides various internal funding sources, noting that such sources are generally competitive. It is therefore the responsibility of the candidate's supervisor, in conjunction with the candidate, to secure the necessary funding to ensure successful completion of the project.
