## Master of Information Studies (with specialisations)

Gain an understanding of how to create, evaluate, collect, organise and disseminate information across a variety of institutions, including archives and libraries. Complete a set of core foundation subjects, then specialise and broaden your professional expertise in an area that interests you.

You can also choose to finish early and exit with one of two qualifications:

## **Specialisations**

### **Applied Research**

Develop advanced research skills, and design and undertake an independent research project as part of your degree. This specialisation also provides a pathway into PhD study.

## Children's Librarianship

Support the learning and information needs of children and young adults in public libraries. Explore their literature, and develop and implement tailored collections, services and library programs.

## Data Management

Develop your skills in the planning, infrastructure and governance of data. Consider a range of issues related to data handling, including privacy, security, data preservation, storage and distribution.

## Information Management

Analyse, evaluate and contribute to the development of systems to organise and retrieve information, and put web accessibility and user experience at the core of your practice.

#### Leadership

Gain the advanced knowledge required for successful leadership in the information industry - from marketing and human resource management to project management and program design.

### Librarianship

Develop the knowledge, skills and strategies to become a leader in the information and library sectors. Learn everything from preservation and curation to digital archiving and community engagement.

## **Records and Archives Management**

Learn the technical and managerial skills to create and maintain effective records and archives across organisations, including classification, record keeping, preservation, access frameworks and digital technologies.
