## Instructions

### Call for Nominations

Nominations are invited for election to the **Faculty Board – Faculty of Business, Justice and Behavioural Sciences** for the following positions under clause 5.g of the Faculty Boards – Membership and Terms of Reference:

- Elected Academic staff member from the **School of Policing Studies**.
- Elected Academic staff member from the **Australian Graduate School of Policing and Security**

Nominations open **19 June 2026** and close **4.00 pm, 3 July 2026**. An election will be held if nominations exceed the number of vacancies. Terms commence immediately and conclude **30 June 2027**.

### Eligibility to Nominate

A nominee must:

- be an academic staff member (Level A, B or C) of the relevant School;
- hold at least **0.5 FTE** at Charles Sturt University; and
- be a permanent staff member or hold a contract with at least **two years remaining** at the date of election.

### How to Nominate

- Candidates may self-nominate by submitting this form before the closing date.
- Eligibility to vote is the same as eligibility to nominate.
- Candidates may provide a **150-word factual statement** for distribution with ballot papers, including:
  - qualifications and experience; and
  - positions or offices held in public bodies, clubs, or organisations, with dates.

The Returning Officer will acknowledge receipt within two working days, where practicable.

### Election Process

- If nominations do not exceed vacancies, the Returning Officer will declare the candidate(s) elected.
- If nominations exceed vacancies, an electronic ballot will be conducted from **6 – 20 July 2026**.

### Election Results

Candidates will be notified by **21 July 2026**. Results will be published in *What's New*.

### Submission

Completed nomination forms must be submitted to [elections@csu.edu.au](mailto:elections@csu.edu.au) by **4.00 pm on Friday, 3 July 2026**. Nominations received after this time will not be accepted. Receipt of nominations will be acknowledged by reply email.
