It is the applicant's responsibility to ensure that references are lodged through the **National Psychology Reference System**, and that these references are made available to CSU. Applications for which references have not been lodged by 15 November 2022 will not be considered.

## COURSE REQUIREMENTS

### Registration with the Psychology Board of Australia

This course is open to:

- applicants who are already registered psychologists (please supply evidence);

AND

- applicants who are seeking to become registered psychologists via completion of this degree.

On acceptance to the course, candidates who do not hold registration as a psychologist must apply to the Psychology Board of Australia for provisional registration. Provisional registration is usually granted for one calendar year and must be maintained.

Online application to the Psychology Board of Australia for provisional registration is available if you:

- have completed an accredited fourth-year psychology degree in the last 10 years (or will be finishing soon), and
- have never previously been registered as a health practitioner or student with one of the 14 health professions boards in Australia, and
- have been offered a place in an accredited fifth- and sixth-year psychology program

All candidates must hold full or provisional registration to undertake the Master of Clinical Psychology. Candidates whose application for provisional registration has been refused by the Psychology Board of Australia will be removed from the program. Candidates who hold full or provisional registration which is subsequently cancelled by the Psychology Board of Australia will also be removed from the program.



### Assessing academic eligibility

This course requires the satisfactory completion of a four-year APAC-accredited qualification in psychology to have been completed within the previous 10 years with Weighted Average Mark (WAM) of 75% or higher (or equivalent qualification) for the 4th year of study.

To enable an accurate assessment, please either supply your WAM, as calculated by the university where your 4<sup>th</sup> year psychology degree was attained or provide the raw marks (%) and the weighting of each subject completed.

### Workplace Learning

The **Master of Clinical Psychology** course requires 1,000 hours of practical work experience in a suitable work role, under the supervision of a psychologist, approved by the Psychology Board of Australia to provide supervision to psychologists and provisional psychologists. Students are responsible for organising their practical work experience and appropriate supervision, in accordance with established guidelines and support from the University, and for all costs associated with the practical work experience.

### Compulsory Attendance Requirements

Two subjects in the first semester of the first year of study have a requirement to attend compulsory online intensive schools in full. Students who are not able to attend these intensive schools will not be able to complete these subjects, and thus will not be able to undertake the program.



## DECLARATIONS

- I acknowledge and accept that, if accepted into the program I am expected to provide a current [National Police Certificate](#) and [Working with Children Check](#) at my own expense
- I acknowledge and accept that I am expected to arrange for references to be submitted to the [National Psychology Reference System](#) at my own expense
- I understand the criteria for provisional registration and acknowledge and accept that, if offered a place in this course, I will be required to apply for and maintain provisional registration for the duration of the degree at my own expense.

### OR

- As a registered psychologist, I understand that I need to maintain registration for the duration of the degree at my own expense
- I understand and accept that, if offered a place in the course, I will be required to attend two compulsory online intensives at the start of the 2023 academic year; if unable to do so, I will be withdrawn from the program.
- I understand that full-time enrolment requires a commitment of approximately 40 hours per week, and that part-time enrolment requires approximately 20 hours per week. I affirm that I am able to adjust any employment or personal commitments to ensure that I allocate the requisite time commitment to my studies.
- I understand and accept that, if offered a place in the course, I will be required to organise my own practical experience and related supervision at my own expense
- I declare that the information and supporting documents I have provided with my application for admission are true and correct
- I acknowledge that submitting deliberately false or misleading information may result in the cancellation of my application, withdrawal of any offer made by the University, or possible exclusion from the University.
