# IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT 'APPLYING FOR LEAVE'

GET YOUR LEAVE IN ONTIME!!!

You may or may not be aware CSCS have a service level agreement with CSU payroll and CSU HR this agreement outlines the responsibilities of both entities.



CSU provide a Payroll officer's who uploads the information we provide into the CSU Alesco payroll system.

As you know the output can only be as good as the input so the information needs to be accurate so that we can all be paid on time and correctly.

Delayed entry of your leave into the online system, can create real issues and frustration for the CSU payroll officer especially when backdated after the payroll has been processed and payed.

It is now a company directive; if you - the employee are able.... have access.... and have the means, must enter this your leave into Alesco prior to commencement or immediately at the first opportunity e.g. after a phone call to say you are unwell and cannot attend work.

Leave can be entered remotely from a mobile device, or at work at any of the computers made available to staff and students. If you need more assistance and or training please put your hand up. Regards

# **Finance Officer Update**

#### Hi Everyone

Fair Work Commission Annual Wage Review

As you may be aware, the Fair Work Commission (FWC) handed down the Annual Wage Review Decision on 1st June 2016 which resulted in a 2.4% increase in the Minimum Wage and all Modern Award salaries effective first full pay period after 30thJune 2016.

As CSCS employees, we have the benefit of working under our own Enterprise Agreement since 2013 and as such we are not limited to the FWC

decision and will in fact be receiving a 2.6% increase payable from the first full pay period commencing after 30th June 2016.

Also the Government's Superannuation Guarantee Rate was set at 9.5% for 2015/2016 and is not due to be increased to 10% until 2021/2022.

However, with our CSCS Enterprise Agreement we have the additional benefit in that our Superannuation Employer contributions have been at the rate 10% since July 2015 and will increase to 10.5% from the first full pay period commencing after 30th June 2016.

In summary, the Charles Sturt Campus Services Enterprise Agreement 2013 will provide us with a total 1.02% of above Award rates of pay and Superannuation over the Modern Cleaning Award as of July 2016 with further guaranteed increases next year.
