**Discuss mid-placement review** (based on the Professional Experience Report) with supervising teacher discussing achievement of each focus area and collaboratively set new goals for the remainder of the placement

- Professional Experience Report discuss how well the TES is achieving each standard/focus area, collaboratively set new goals for the remainder of the placement
- Assist teacher education student to develop and use appropriate classroom management strategies
- Towards the end of the week, allow the teacher education student opportunities to plan and teach sequences of lessons
