What is the FoSH Internal Grant Writing Program?

The FoSH Internal Grant Writing Program includes practical guidance to develop and write a full draft internal grant proposal, ahead of the deadline, receiving expert mentoring and strategic advice while you write with a tribe to support you.

When is the FoSH Internal Grant Writing Program?

The FoSH Internal Grant Writing Program includes a face-to-face and online component run over three months in 2023.

- 28 31 August: Grant Writing Retreat (face-to-face)
- Sept-Nov: Grant Writing Program (online modules)

Who is the program for?

The FoSH Internal Grant Writing Program is to:

- Support and provide mentorship to FOSH early career researchers and academics re-entering research who demonstrate clear evidence of high research potential to apply for the <u>Faculty</u> <u>ECR Grant Scheme</u> in 2023 or who can identify a small external grant opportunity to progress their research careers;
- Provide early career researchers and academics re-entering research with experience in preparing a grant application for peer review for projects that are strategically aligned with the Faculty FOR priority areas;
- Encourage establishment of an early career researcher's research pathway;
- Provide experience in applying for competitive continuation funding for high quality projects and / or pilot research projects that will lead to external grant applications;
- Build early career researchers' and academics re-entering research track record in producing high quality/high impact outputs in order to enhance competitiveness in bidding for external research funds
