Master of Adult and Vocational Education

Graduate Diploma of Adult and Vocational Education Graduate Certificate in Adult and Vocational Education

The Master of Adult and Vocational Education is designed for people employed, or seeking employment at a senior level as trainers, learning facilitators or consultants in the adult and vocational education sectors, including Registered Training Organisations. Undertaking Masters-level research subjects gives you the opportunity to explore your particular area of interest in more depth and a pathway to higher-level research awards.

The Graduate Certificate in Adult and Vocational Education is a great pathway option into postgraduate study. You only need to complete four subjects and upon graduation you may receive credit into the Graduate Diploma and Masters programs.

Credit

Credit for prior learning and credit for current competencies will be granted to eligible applicants.

Admission information

At a minimum, recognised vocational qualifications including a Certificate III, advanced certificate (Certificate IV), associate diploma, diploma or appropriate tertiary qualification and a minimum of three years relevant experience are required for admission. Other qualifications may be deemed as equivalent by the Course Director. Evidence of enrolment or completion of the TAE40110/ TAE40116 Certificate IV in Training and Assessment is also required.
