It is the applicant's responsibility to ensure that references are lodged through the **National Psychology Reference System**, and that these references are made available to CSU. Applications for which references have not been lodged by 15 November 2022 will not be considered.

COURSE REQUIREMENTS

Registration with the Psychology Board of Australia

On acceptance to the course, candidates must apply to the Psychology Board of Australia for provisional registration. Provisional registration is usually granted for one calendar year and must be maintained for the duration of the 5+1 internship program: for the duration of this degree (the "5" of the 5+1) and for the duration of the year of supervised practice (the "1" of the 5+1, also referred to as the "internship") https://www.psychologyboard.gov.au/Registration/Provisional.aspx

Online application to the Psychology Board of Australia for provisional registration in the 5+1 program is available if you:

- have completed an accredited fourth year psychology degree in the last 10 years (or will be finishing soon), and
- have never previously been registered as a health practitioner or student with one of the 14 health professions boards in Australia, and
- have been offered a place in an accredited fifth year psychology program

Compulsory Attendance Requirements

Two subjects in the first semester of the first year of study have a requirement to attend <u>compulsory</u> online intensive schools in full. Students who are not able to attend these intensive schools will not be able to complete these subjects, and thus will not be able to undertake the program.

Workplace Learning

The Master of Professional Psychology (with specialisations) course requires 300 hours of practical work experience in a suitable work role, under the supervision of a psychologist, approved by the Psychology Board of Australia to provide supervision to psychologists and provisional psychologists. Students are responsible for organising their practical work experience and appropriate supervision, in accordance with established guidelines and support from the University, and for all costs associated with the practical work experience.

Applicants who receive a scholarship from the NSW Department of Education and receive an offer for the Master of Professional Psychology (School Psychology) specialisation will undertake placements at schools designated by the Department: these students will, therefore, not be required to locate their own practical experience and supervision.

Assessing academic eligibility

This course requires the satisfactory completion of a four-year APAC-accredited qualification in psychology to have been completed within the previous 10 years with Weighted Average Mark (WAM) of 75% or higher (or equivalent qualification) for the 4th year of study.

To enable an accurate assessment, please either supply your WAM, as calculated by the university where your 4th year psychology degree was attained or provide the raw marks (%) and the weighting of each subject completed.
