


Working Together: School Engagement Guide 2025

#### Our purpose

Our purpose is to raise aspiration, encourage excitement and widen participation for all students considering studying at university.

We achieve this by executing a range of activities with the aim of exposing potential students to a diverse range of courses and careers.

Our activities are aligned with curriculum and designed with a strong focus on academic preparedness and achievement.

We have a strong focus on ensuring that students from equity groups, such as first in family and First Nations, are empowered to make informed decisions about their educational and vocational futures.

#### Our mission

We strive to familiarise them with the world of university study, emphasising the advantages of higher education, addressing potential barriers, and instilling confidence as they consider tertiary education as a viable option for their future careers.



# Everyone's journey to uni is different

That's why Charles Sturt has a number of enabling courses. They prepare students for university study – and give guaranteed entry into most of our bachelor's degrees.

### **Access Charles Sturt Entry**

Access Charles Sturt Entry is for anyone wanting to take the first step toward being ready to study an undergraduate degree.

The course is designed to help students develop the skills and confidence needed to succeed at university. This free, six-month course provides guaranteed entry into the Undergraduate Certificate in University Preparation – which then guarantees entry and credit into a future bachelor degree.

#### Undergraduate Certificate in University Preparation

The Undergraduate Certificate in University Preparation is for those students who might not have received the ATAR they needed for their dream course.

During the course, students will develop academic skills and choose subjects across the disciplines of science, maths, writing and history to match their future study goals. Upon successful completion of this course, students get guaranteed entry into a wide range of Charles Sturt bachelor's degrees and undergraduate certificates.

#### Connections First Nations Direct Entry Program

Connections is our dedicated admission pathway for First Nations students. It's a five-day on-campus experience that can lead to guaranteed entry to many of our bachelor's degrees.

During the Connections program participants get a chance to:

- · meet staff and fellow participants
- discover our dedicated First Nations support services
- complete a range of activities to determine suitability for their chosen course.

And, we cover travel, accommodation and food!

Those who successfully complete the program will receive an offer to study with us. If a participant isn't successful, that's no problem – we can get them started with a university preparation course.

They're skills like emotional intelligence, empathy, collaboration, communication, resilience and a commitment to creating a world worth living in. They're valued by employers and help your students excel – because they're important for any job, in any industry.

We value these skills and want to reward your Year 12 students for having these special qualities. That's why we're changing the way they can apply for an early offer to Charles Sturt.

#### Get the advantage

If your students are successful, they'll unlock a world of possibilities. Not only will they receive a study offer before they sit exams, they'll also become part of an exclusive program that will support them as they transition to become an official Charles Sturt student.

#### How it works

We'll look at the student's Year 11 results and their soft skills, not just their final ATAR. To get the advantage, they'll apply online and answer three simple questions to show they have what it takes to make an impact in their community.

If successful, the student could get an early offer to study one of our undergraduate degrees before they sit exams. We offer almost all of our undergraduate courses through the program.

Our future students team can come to your school and provide your students with all the information they'll need to prepare their Charles Sturt Advantage application.

Plus, every student who applies will be automatically considered for exclusive scholarships.
