

Living Hot: Surviving and Thriving on a Heating Planet

In his challenging new book coauthored with George Wilkenfeld, Clive Hamilton argues that, in the long-running climate change policy debate, we have the emphasis all wrong. There is little we in Australia can do about the climate we will be living through over the rest of this century. Those decisions are being made by the big carbon polluters. But we can do an enormous amount to Australia for the harsher prepare climatic conditions we know coming. So why are we doing so little to build resilience to protect future generations?
