Master of Information Leadership

Graduate Certificate in Information Leadership [exit point only]

The Master of Information Leadership will give you the knowledge and skills to progress your career as an information professional. Informed by research and information practice and drawing on national and international expertise, the course explores the evolving challenges of leadership in information agencies. It will provide you with leadership strategies, techniques and tools to enhance your effectiveness as a leader in the information sector. As a graduate, you'll be equipped with the knowledge and skills to encourage the development of leadership, judgment and responsibility in a variety of information contexts.

Graduate Certificate in Audiovisual Archiving

Designed in consultation with The National Film and Sound Archive, this course prepares you for work in the audiovisual archiving industry and related areas. It introduces the history, philosophy and ethics behind audiovisual archiving, including the structures, strategies and skills used in audiovisual management activities. You will learn about the appropriate preservation and storage methods to manage deterioration of audiovisual objects, along with the principles and practices underlying collection development, collection management and access.

Master of Education (Teacher Librarianship)

The Master of Education (Teacher Librarianship) is ideal if you are seeking to become a teacher librarian, or practising teacher librarian, without a full specialist qualification in teacher librarianship. With a focus on understanding the continually evolving nature of learning needs in schools, and the role information resources play, the course will enhance your skills in incorporating information literacy, literature and technologies into the curriculum. You'll explore resourcing for curriculum innovation, discover creative organisational thinking, work with existing and emerging media tools and learn to take a leadership role in enabling teachers and students to be lifelong learners and active participants in local or global learning environments.

Master of Information Studies (with specialisations)

Graduate Diploma of Information Studies
Graduate Certificate in Information Studies

The Master of Information Studies (with specialisations) reflects the importance of information and knowledge management across fields and institutions including archives and libraries. The course provides you with an understanding of the creation, evaluation, collection, organisation, utilisation and dissemination of information. You'll study a set of core foundation subjects, followed by elective subjects which allow for specialisations in areas such as librarianship, records and archives, information and knowledge management, information architecture, community informatics, librarianship for children and youth or data management.

Master of Education (Knowledge Networks and Digital Innovation)

Graduate Certificate in Education (Knowledge Networks and Digital Innovation) [exit point only]

By studying the Master of Education (Knowledge Networks and Digital Innovation) you will become an agile leader in new cultures of digital formal and informal learning. The program includes flexible study options in knowledge networking, global information flow, advanced search techniques, learning analytics, social media, game-based learning, digital literature, learning spaces design and more. If you are an educator, school leader, ICT integrator, teacher librarian, instructional designer, learning support specialist or teacher educator seeking to develop expertise in global and community networked knowledge environments, this course is for you.

Bachelor of Information Studies (with specialisations)

The Bachelor of Information Studies (with specialisations) is equivalent to three years' full-time study and consists of a core set of foundation subjects, followed by a wide range of elective subjects which allow for optional specialisations in Librarianship, Information and Knowledge Management, and Records and Archives Management. As a graduate you'll have the opportunity to work in professional positions in Australia and internationally. With a focus on linking practice with knowledge, this course allows you to explore some of Australia's leading knowledge, collecting and information institutions.
