Charles Sturt University was established in 1989 and is Australia's largest regional university with campuses in Albury-Wodonga, Bathurst, Canberra, Dubbo, Goulburn, Orange, Port Macquarie, Wagga Wagga and, from early 2024, North Sydney. Located in some of Australia's fastest growing regional cities, Charles Sturt not only has a demonstrated engagement with local communities and regional industries but boasts national and international reach through cutting-edge education and research. Our mission is to advance the careers of our students, inspire research excellence, and drive regional outcomes with global impact. *Yindyamarra Winhanganha*, *creating a world worth living in*, is our purpose and guiding principle.

Charles Sturt is well-known for its innovative approach to education; we are Australia's online university of choice. We have a strong capacity for flexible delivery with an international reputation for exceptional online learning, providing exciting educational opportunities for students worldwide. More than 33,000 students are currently enrolled at Charles Sturt, from across Australia and in more than 120 countries around the globe. We are dedicated to supporting all our students to succeed.
