Insights to inform adaptive management based on monitoring during this period include the recommendations: top-ups for Waugorah lagoon (an important refuge site for native fish and turtles); potential top-ups or maintenance of water deliveries until March to support Southern bell frog recruitment in the North Redbank and Western Lakes.
