WHAT IS A CAMPUS ENVIRONMENT WORKING GROUP (CEWG)?

The CEWG's are campus-based groups of staff and students, who work together with Sustainability at Charles Sturt to help make our University more sustainable. A CEWG has been established on each of our major teaching campuses Albury - Wodonga, Bathurst, Dubbo, Orange, Port Macquarie, Wagga Wagga.

THE SPECIFIC ROLES OF THE CEWGs ARE TO:

Help develop and implement strategies to achieve Charles Sturt's sustainability targets through actions such as leading projects, seeking funding, and contributing to educational programs for the wider University community.

Initiate environmental or recreational projects to promote or enhance sustainability on campus

Prepare an annual report, outlining the environmental initiatives undertaken by the group, and suggest possible future initiatives.

Recommend representatives to attend environmental conferences, as deemed appropriate by the University

To support the facilitation of the implementation of the 16 LiFE action plans to progress towards best practice in sustainability.

All Charles Sturt staff and students are eligible to join their CEWG.

Selection is by expression of interest, with members chosen to represent a range of University schools, offices and divisions.
