

Leaders & Managers Program (LAMP)

Overview

The Leaders and Managers program comprises four online modules completed over a one year period.

The content of the program is focused on the higher education sector and has been developed by the LH Martin Institute in partnership with ATEM (the Association for Tertiary Education Management). The program is suitable for emerging leaders and leaders who have the opportunity to lead or manage people, programs or processes within their work.

There are 20 funded places available in this program. Acceptance into the program is a competitive selection process and applicants are asked to complete the additional supporting statement in their application form. Applicants will need to detail their experience in leading or managing people, processes or projects.

Participants who successfully complete the program will receive an internal certificate of completion from CSU.

There are four modules in the program:

Eligibility

- Must undertake the course as a single course of study;
- Has the support of their supervisor to undertake the program, and the supervisor is willing to support up to four hours of study leave per week as per the <u>CSU Study Leave Policy</u>;
- Is willing to spend some of their own private time studying in order to successfully complete the program;
- Holds a continuing appointment at CSU, or a fixed term appointment until at least June 2020 (part time is acceptable); and
- Has the opportunity to lead or manage people, programs or processes within their work.
