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A postgraduate qualification to boost your career

Weighing up options

Throughout my teaching career, I had often seen students supported by specialist teachers and school counsellors. I also really appreciated the assistance and guidance that I had been given along the way by different people. So when I first started to think of a different work life, I thought *How can I be like them? How can I apply the skill set I already have to a different career path in education?*

I began to reach out to people in my network, particularly school counsellors, to see what my future career might look like – and psychology seemed like a good fit.

Time for a change

Originally, I thought I would learn better in a face-to-face, on-campus environment. But then I discovered the Graduate Diploma in Psychology (a 100 per cent online course) – and I changed my mind. It became very clear that this course was made for me and my situation. It felt like the product had been tailored specifically for me, and I couldn't go past that!

After not studying for very long time, I thought I was going to be very out of touch. I was told about Charles Sturt's Study Link subjects – short, online courses aimed at brushing up your study skills before your classes begin. There are lots of different subjects on offer – from how to use the library, to essay writing and referencing. I did all of them! And I felt better prepared for study generally by doing so.

Exploring online study

When you study an online course, you can play to your strengths – and build a schedule that suits your situation. I can study when I want. I can do as little or as much as I like. It's all my choice.

All the things I was scared about... have actually been fine. I was stressed about the actual study part of my degree, as well as money and balancing work and life. But everything has worked out well. I know in the back of my mind that I'm working towards something that will benefit me in the long run. The other part is: now that I'm older, I know that I really want this. I want to be a psychologist, and I want to be as prepared as I can be for that career path.

Choose how far you'll go

What's right for you?

We have different types of postgraduate courses so you can find the right level of study for your career goals.

Micro-credentials

Our micro-credentials are designed to help you make a difference. Ranging from two to four points, a micro-credential lets you gain the skills you need in a fraction of the time it takes to study a single subject or full degree. You'll be on your way to creating your own qualification in no time at all.

Graduate diploma

Take on your next step in postgraduate study after completing your graduate certificate. Sometimes this qualification is available to you if you don't have a bachelor's degree but have relevant work experience.

Master's degree

Give yourself a competitive edge with a master's degree. You can study your master's by coursework to delve into advanced critical analysis of your chosen subject and become the specialist you want to be.

Single subjects

Dip your toe into university study or gain knowledge of a particular area to boost your career. Study a single subject (or two!) to hone a new skill or get back into the groove of studying. The best part? Single subjects count towards a related degree. It's a win-win.

Higher Degree by Research

Whether a master's by research or a PhD, you'll add new knowledge to your area of interest through original research. Make new discoveries and undertake groundbreaking work, opening up opportunities in academia, research and policy.

Graduate certificate


Open up a world of opportunity with a graduate certificate. Typically, in the space of six months to a year, you'll get advanced knowledge and an admission pathway to your future postgrad study. What are you waiting for?

Don't forget, when it comes to your study, you're in control. You can study full-time, part-time or alter your study schedule throughout your course if your circumstances change.

How long does postgraduate study take?

If you study full-time, these are the typical durations for postgraduate study.

- Micro-credential – 8 weeks
- Single subject – 16 weeks
- Graduate certificate – 6 months
- Graduate diploma – 1 year
- Master's – 1.5 years
- Doctorate – 3 years



Flexible study – you're in control

Everyone has different priorities; demands on their time and responsibilities they need to take care of. We get that. It's why we put flexibility at the heart of postgraduate study. But what do we really mean when we say flexible study? Well, it's about three main things.

Choose where and when you study

Our postgraduate courses are all available online, and everything you need is there at the click of a mouse. So you can study wherever suits you, and when it's most convenient in your schedule. Early riser or night owl – with 24/7 access, recorded lectures and round-the-clock support, you can choose your **ideal study time**.

Start when you're ready

When you're ready, we're ready. At Charles Sturt we have multiple start dates across the year for you to begin the next step of your study journey. So you can find one that's right for you and your family. You can start most postgraduate courses in February, July or November. Select courses also have more start dates – we call the micro-sessions – dotted through the year. So depending on your course, you could also choose to start in January, March, May, June, August or October.

Change if you need to

You can choose to start your course full-time or part-time. You can also start with a single subject and build from there. The key thing to remember is that we know life has a habit of changing. So at Charles Sturt, you can change your study schedule to accommodate it. Got some clearer road in front of you? Take on an extra subject or two. Life looking pretty full? Scale back to just one or two subjects. It's your course, done your way.

Upskill – and futureproof your career

Upskilling: what is it and how can it help you?

You want a fulfilling – and sustainable – career. How can you achieve that? The answer is ongoing skill development. In a word, upskilling.

Upskilling refers to learning new skills to improve your performance – and possibilities – in your current career. Continual skill development is a necessity in our changing world of work. But there's also a lot in it for you personally.

For instance, upskilling could make you more secure in your role. After all, if you're always staying at the cutting edge of your industry, and learning the latest skills and knowledge, your employer is going to recognise your value. You'll be the one driving innovation and performance.

Upskilling could also mean you move on – and up – from your current job. More skills, newer perspective, extra qualifications – these are exactly the sort of things that make a candidate stand out when applying for a job.

Top five reasons to upskill

3. **New opportunities:** having new skills opens up a world of possibility and opportunities in new areas for you to explore.

5. **Job satisfaction:** specialise in an area that you truly love when you align your skills to your career goals.

The good news? Upskilling can be a small step – a short course where you could study a micro-credential or single subject. If you want to delve a bit deeper, you could study a graduate certificate in as little as six months.

How do you start upskilling?

You don't need to reinvent the wheel when you upskill. Upskilling lets you build on your existing knowledge base to keep yourself at the cutting edge of your industry. If you're looking for a career change, there's always the option of reskilling too. Reskilling lets you develop a set of brand new skills so you can tackle those uncharted waters and try out that new career you've been thinking about.

CSP

Some postgraduate courses have commonwealth supported places (CSP), which means the government pays a percentage of your fees. Chat to us to find out if there are CSP for the course you're interested in.

Tax deduction

If there's a direct connection between your study and your work, you may be able to claim your tuition fees as a tax deduction.

A tax agent, financial adviser or the Australian Taxation Office can guide you on educational deductions.

Scholarships and grants

Did you know we offer more than \$3 million in scholarships and grants at Charles Sturt? Don't rule yourself out of the running, there's an extensive range of scholarships and grants on offer.

Many scholarships get left on the shelf because people assume they won't get one, so they don't even apply. Trust us, it's worth your while to apply – for as many as you can.

FEE-HELP

You may be eligible for FEE-HELP when you study one of our postgraduate courses. FEE-HELP is a government loan that, if you're eligible, you can use to pay your tuition fees, by deferring payment until you earn a certain amount.

Study Link

Study Link will make your transition to university a little easier and give you the confidence to succeed.

Study Link subjects are short, self-paced, non-credit bearing courses. You can brush up on writing, maths, statistics, and science or information technology. Supported by a real person (your subject coordinator) you can work your way through at your own pace (take up to five months if you need to).

Academic Skills team

We have a team of professionals who are ready to help you hone your academic writing and put together an assignment.

Reach out and they'll support you with one-to-one consultations and assignment feedback and steer you in the direction of workshops that may also be of benefit.

Individual support

Whether you're in your first session of study or your last year with us, we'll have your back.

Individual academic skills support is available when you book a 30-minute appointment. It can be face-to-face, via Skype, phone, online or through email. Whatever works for you.

Whether its getting to grips with academic writing again, or building literacy or numeracy skills, we can help – and our advisers can even design you an individual learning plan.

Built-in help

Did you know that we are also embedding academic skills help into most of our courses? That means the help you're after is actually delivered as part of your course – it's built-in to your workload and time frame.

For example, if a subject requires you to write an academic report, it's likely that guidance or a workshop on doing just that will be part of the subject's workload.

Assignment feedback service

Want better marks? We can help you get there.

Connect in real-time with the experts at Studiosity – they'll give you direction on your academic writing.

Upload your draft assignment to Studiosity and tell them what you want guidance on – like referencing, spelling, grammar or sentence structure. They'll give you feedback and some advice on things you can do to improve. And they'll usually come back to you within a few hours!

In one year our students uploaded more than 19,000 assignments for feedback! That's a lot of help.

Online discussion forum

Got a question about academic writing? Not sure about a tricky reference? Ask an academic skills adviser by posting your question on our online forum.

The forum is checked seven days a week and you're guaranteed to get an answer within 24 hours. (Mostly it's much faster than that!)

Many times someone else has already raised the question – so plug your question into the forum, use the subject number and find the answers you seek!

Online workshops

We also have a suite of online workshop resources specifically for our postgraduate students. Available anytime, these sessions will equip you with valuable information, tools and tricks on essential topics, such as critical thinking, time management, proofreading and academic reading.

Study that fits

I worked full-time and weekends were filled with sport and driving kids around, so studying at Charles Sturt was very flexible – it suited me. If I had a busy week I could put study on hold and get back to it the following weekend.

But the idea of flexibility went further than that. With my course, it was really flexible with exit points as well. I took a little break for a couple of years because we bought another business at work and that was hectic – so I exited with a graduate diploma.

It was the perfect way to put it on pause. Then when things got knocked into shape at work I re-enrolled in my master's and I found that everything I'd already studied counted towards that. That was brilliant.

Hop online

Navigating online study with Charles Sturt was user friendly. I found the online platforms were easy to use compared to other websites and setups I have at work.

Everything you need is online and you soon get into the routine that suits you. I'd finish work and then do half an hour of study every afternoon. That just kept me up to speed with everything.

And the subject forums were active and engaging and that helped build connection with other students and lecturers.

Did you know?

You can upgrade your social work qualification with our Master of Social Work (Professional Qualifying) or extend your practice through our Master of Advanced Social Work Practice.

1. Buy-in

Once you have decided to make your next move count – and begin postgraduate study with us – get everyone around you on board.

- Discuss with your partner, children and extended family why you want to study.
- Explain the study expectations and how they will impact upon your family.
- Don't forget to also chat with your friends and employer.

2. Organise (and delegate)

- Offload some of your home tasks to free up some time to study.
- Know what time of day best suits you to study.
- Review your subject material as soon as it's available online.

Remember, include your full name, applicant ID and date of birth with your eQual submissions – so we can attach it to the right application.

You can also submit transcripts and documents to us through the application portal, or email documents to admissions@csu.edu.au. These should be PDF files and include your full name, applicant ID and date of birth.

Want to start studying in July? For the best chance of securing a spot in your preferred course, get your application to us by 30 April 2021.

Start in November 2021

If you're looking to start study in November, get your application to us by 3 September 2021.

Start in February 2022

Get organised to start study in the new year by getting your application to us by 29 October 2021.

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
