This presentation will describe Dr Garner's current research program, which seeks to develop an understanding of best practice in the provision of library services for young people living in corrective custody. Her research is funded by the CSU Research Establishment Grant. Dr Garner will explain how this grant money is supporting the program, and her plans for conducting and reporting the results. She will discuss her plans to undertake field work in South Carolina (USA) and how the research will be used by the Victorian Department of Justice and Community Safety and the South Australian Government Youth Justice Department to guide the provision of library services for incarcerated youth.
