Health Heroes Careers in a Case





Healthy Heroes uses immersive learning experiences to enable senior high school students to build leadership skills, and to increase awareness of the breadth of health-related careers available to them. Students will get to know the tools of health trades while learning about relevant career opportunities and building their communication and leadership skills.

Students can expect to participate in activities such as:

- CPR training (unofficial)
- Visual acuity and health obstacle course
- Heart health monitoring
- Concussion assessment and balance control
- Microscopy and histology experiments
- Dental impressions
- Virtual reality experiences
- Infection control

Each of the activities is linked to health profession discussions, with the goal of expanding the students understanding of the diverse opportunities available to them in a career in health.

Health Heroes consists of two key elements in delivery:

UpSkill:

Senior students participate in and are guided through up to 6 career specific practical activities. The students are led by Three Rivers UDRH staff and Charles Sturt's Rural Health Club members. Each module has a Health Career training package with an imbedded practical activity. They will be equipped with the knowledge skills required to master a module for delivery to a younger year group.

Skillsharing:

Year 6 & 7 students will rotate through up to 6 health related practical activities, demonstrated by the senior students and supported by Charles Sturt staff and students. Junior peers will engage in all interactive learning experiences. Senior students will enhance their leaderships skills with increased confidence and consolidate their knowledge of health related industries and pathways.

Three Rivers' activities are aimed towards increasing and supporting our local rural health workforce.
