Context around the pilot

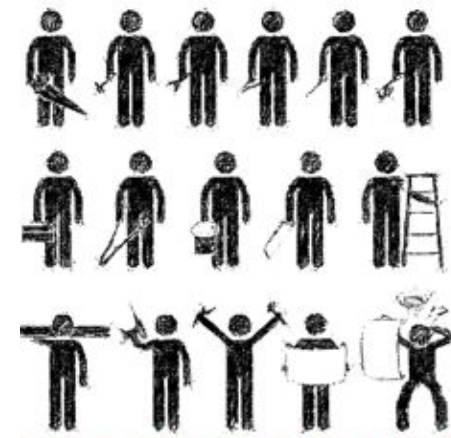
Text-based assessment - how did we get here?

Pre-existing 'disparate' systems and / or processes required for:

1. Assessment Submission (Student)
2. Assessment Grading & Feedback (Instructor)
3. Academic Integrity (Student & Instructor)

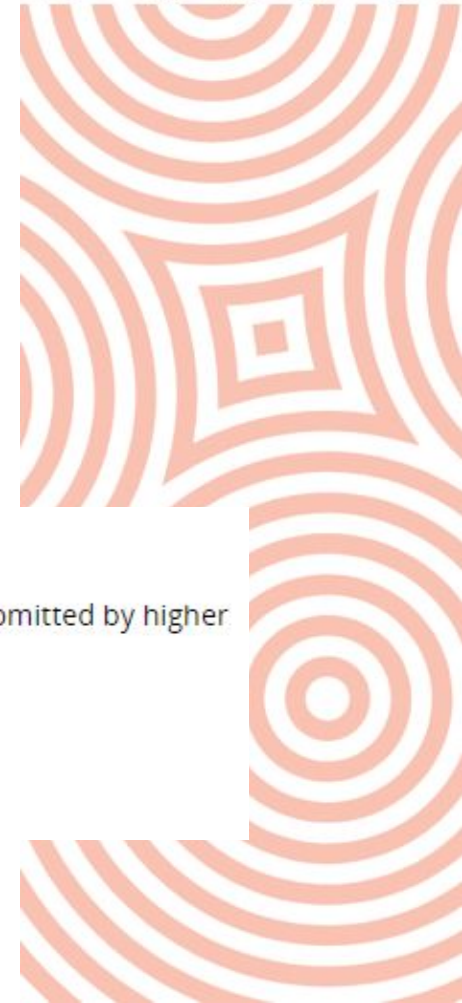
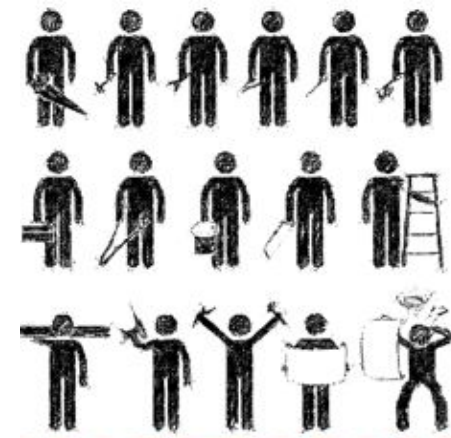
CSU Academic Integrity Policy

Similarity checking of assessment work

- (26) The University will use similarity checking software to check all text-based assessment work submitted by students, and all textual theses submitted by higher degree research candidates, for similarity with other texts and correct referencing of the work of others. Accordingly:
- a. all text-based assignments for coursework courses will be submitted:
 - i. in a digital format that can be checked by the University's similarity-checking software;

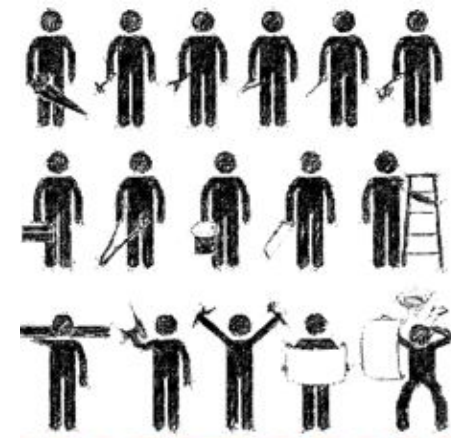


The Implementation

Just follow the recipe.. sort of..

Steps:

1. Instructor creates one assignment portal for each relevant assessment (with data matching the subject outline info)
2. Student goes into the relevant assessment folder, clicks on submission portal link, uploads their assessment (resub. Up until the delivery date)
3. Due date - marking can begin in the feedback studio (multi-mode feedback possible)
4. Grade (linked) flows back into the Grade Centre (hidden column)
5. When feedback release date is achieved, students can go back into the TII portal and see grade, feedback etc. OR (column unhidden - 'My Grades')

How the Integration Works

STREAMLINE (in theory)

Some parameters to keep in mind:

- no sign in / account creation required
- potential single location for all processes
- aligns with the university's 'Educative' rhetoric re. Academic Integrity processes

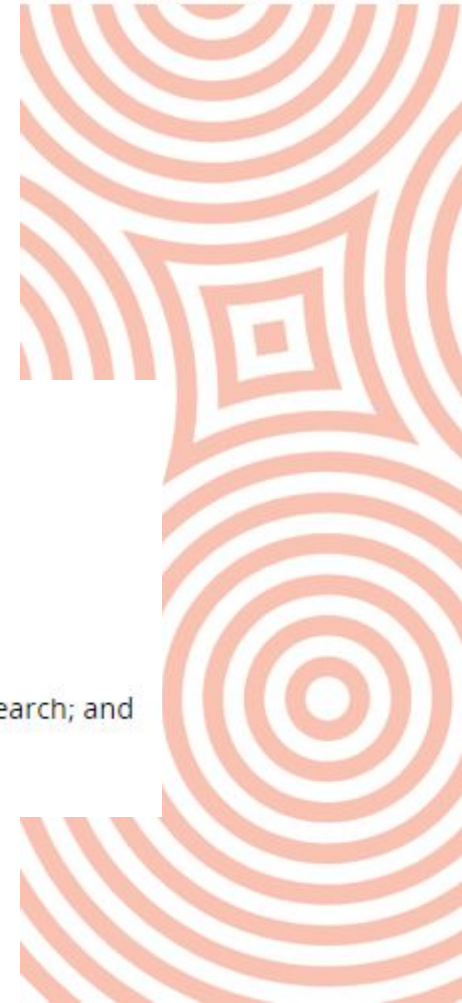
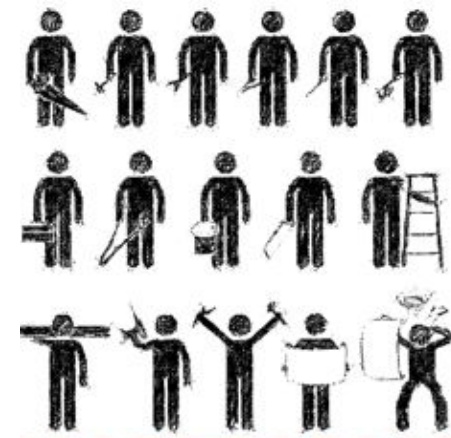
Educative approach to academic integrity

(20) The University takes an educative approach to academic integrity, because students:

- a. join the University from diverse backgrounds, by diverse entry pathways and at different stages of study;
- b. may not have gained an understanding of academic integrity in their previous studies;
- c. when they first undertake a research project, may not yet have received a thorough introduction to the responsible conduct of research; and
- d. need support to develop academic skills that will enable them to avoid breaching academic integrity.

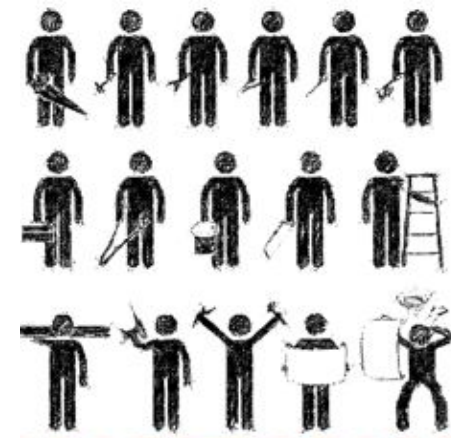


Taking Stock

- Is the grade sync working?



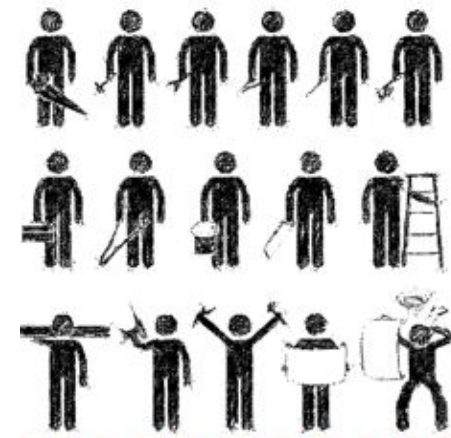

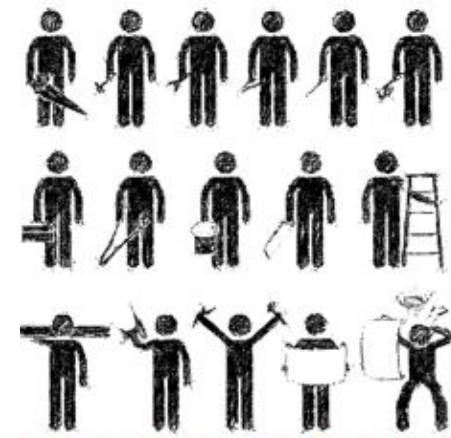

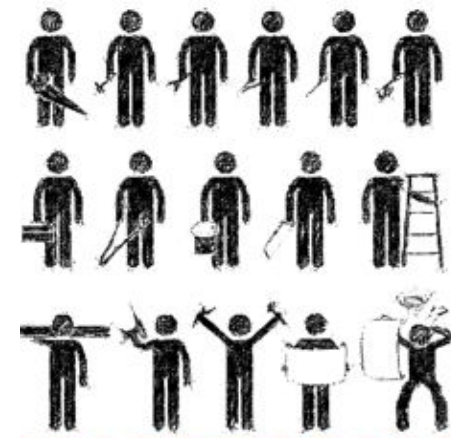
Audio Comments?

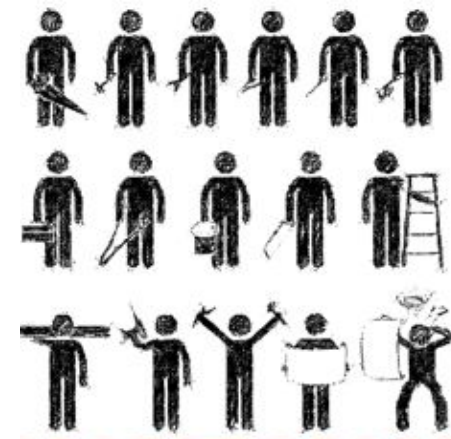
