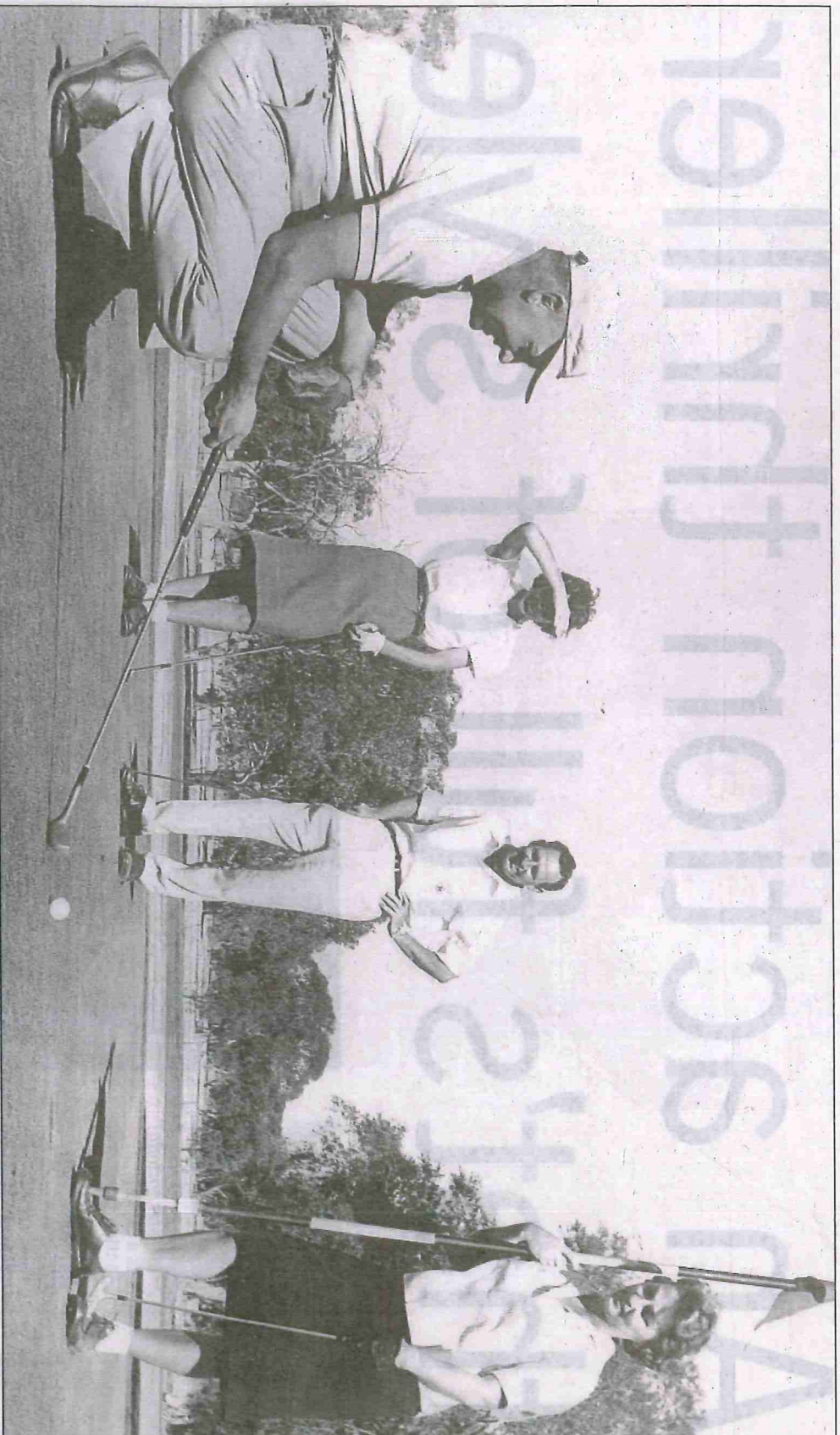


**What you should know**

In view of the importance that the people of Wagga place on sport, Charles Sturt University Regional Archives (CSURA) believes it is essential to preserve the history of our region's sportsperson, and the clubs and associations that have encouraged their development.

We are making a general request for sporting boodies to deposit their records with us.

Our aim is to expand our collection so that potential researchers or historians will have greater access to information, and to ensure that the information will survive in years to come.

The types of records we are interested in include minute books, correspondence, photographs, player lists, scorebooks, clippings, souvenir programmes, newsletters, membership records, financial records, constitutions, competition results, and memorabilia.

CSURA is a combined function regional repository with holdings of over 4000 linear metres, including University records, State Government agency archives and private records.

CSURA is the approved State Records NSW regional repository in the Riverina and Murray regions for the collection of state archives. The CSURA provides a secure and stable environment for the storage of archives and records.



The premises are air-conditioned to obtain an ideal temperature for the storage of archival documents and records, and are also protected by an alarmed security system and a Vesda smoke detection system.

Furthermore, records deposited at CSURA are under the care of qualified and professional staff members.

Currently the CSURA employs two archivists, a librarian and an art curator, all of whom have professional qualifications.

It is assured that records would be well cared for and would prove to be valuable resources for researchers.

If any material is deemed to be personal or confidential, access restrictions or conditions could be imposed on your records accordingly. Records deposited at the archives are arranged and described to make it easier to



find particular items.

The records are fully listed and stored in acid-free archival boxes.

We are also able to provide a same-day service for records that need to be retrieved by your organisation.

We currently have records for a number of regional sport clubs and associations including Bidgee District Pony Club, Country Rugby Union Referees Association, Euberta Tennis Club, East Wagga Softball Club, Narrandera Cricket Association, Wagga City Bowling Club, Wagga Country Club Women's Committee, Wagga Junior Rugby League, Wagga Square Dance Set, Wagga Volleyball Association.
