ABOUT THE EVENT

The Symposium is a great opportunity to extend peer networks, to develop presentation skills suitable for communicating with a non-specialist audience and take advantage of the professional development workshops designed to enhance your research career.

- **Honours students** – attendance and presenting is not compulsory but it is encouraged.
- **Doctoral students** are expected to attend a total of three and present at two symposia during their candidature.
- **Research Masters** students are expected to attend a total of two and present at one symposium during their candidature.

Candidates in their first session full-time or first year part-time are encouraged to attend but are not expected to present.

Candidates who are not able to attend will need to provide evidence of presenting at an alternative conference.

Presentations

Students will be expected to present a ten-minute seminar on their research, suitable for a non-specialist audience. This will be followed by five minutes of question time. The best HDR seminar will be awarded a maximum of **\$800.00** to be used for professional development. The Honours student judged to have presented the best seminar will be awarded a maximum of **\$400.00** to be used for professional development. These awards are granted by the Faculty of Science and Health.

All abstracts are to be submitted by 15th **September 2022**. All PowerPoint presentations are to be submitted by 1st **November 2022**. Refer to the [Presenter Guide](#) for further details.

Posters

A selection of posters will be presented on the day and will compete for a **\$300.00** prize. Please indicate on the registration form if you intend to submit a poster. It is not expected that every student will present a poster. Rather, if you already have a poster prepared, e.g., from another conference, this is an opportunity to present your work at the Symposium. Refer to the [Presenter Guide](#) for further details.
