POINT OF INTEREST from TED WOLFE

Ted Wolfe informed us of CSU executive proposals to disestablish the current Faculty of Science & Agriculture (FSA) and merge this Faculty with the Faculty of Health Sciences. There has even been an idea floated that the current School of Agricultural and Veterinary Sciences SAVS also be dis-established and replaced by a School of Animal and Veterinary Sciences, with the remaining part of Agriculture merging with Viticulture to form a new School. While School members do not necessarily oppose a new faculty of Agriculture and Health Sciences, they are unanimously opposed to the foolish idea of splitting SAVS.

While the Deputy Vice-Chancellor, Professor Ross Chambers, has indicated that there will be no splits or mergers that are strongly opposed, there are many academics in SAVS who remain concerned about the possibility of major disruption. A split School is certain to be detrimental to future profile of CSU in agricultural education. Other complicating factors are Jim Pratley's (Dean, FSA) probable retirement in June 2006, and the changes that might follow the amalgamation of FSA with health. Jim Pratley, Ted Wolfe & John Mahon are concerned. Ted Wolfe and John Mahon want WACOBU members to be aware of this threat to split SAVS, and to voice their opinion strongly if, later in winter, the split proposal is put before the new Faculty Dean or the CSU Council.

Ted Wolfe will be away overseas until July 26 but will try to keep WACOBU members posted on developments. He will email relevant news to all members of WACOBU should the need arise.

It is important that Ted gets this message across to the club and the potential impact this will have on the survival of the School of Agricultural and Veterinary Sciences and the courses that it provides (including several strands in the BSc (Agriculture) degree, Equine Studies and Veterinary Science).
