

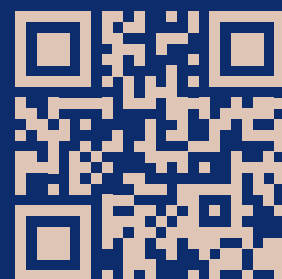

Our courses span across early childhood, primary and secondary education and will give you the opportunity to make your mark on the world.

Embedded work-integrated learning across our degrees means you'll graduate with real-world skills.

Each program provides ample opportunities to engage in classroom situations with guidance and supervision from current, experienced teachers. All courses have relevant professional accreditation and are delivered by experts. You're in capable hands as you begin your teacher journey with us.

Courses

Bachelor of Education (Primary)

This course is offered on campus or online and you can specialise in one of the primary curriculum teaching areas. Choose from Creative Arts; English; Human Society and Its Environment (HSIE); Mathematics; Personal Development, Health and Physical Education (PDHPE), and Science and Technology. Study a range of electives within these areas or choose from topics such as general education studies, early childhood education, First Nations studies and psychology.

Bachelor of Education (Secondary)

This course is offered online* and you can specialise in two teaching areas, including Creative Arts; English; Human Society and Its Environment (HSIE); Mathematics; Personal Development, Health and Physical Education (PDHPE), and Science.

If you choose to specialise in PDHPE, be prepared for an on-campus element while Science will require you to complete compulsory intensives. Our workplace learning team will aim to find placements at the location of your choice. This degree is recognised nationally.

Bachelor of Education (Birth to Five Years)

Offered entirely online, this degree enables you to upgrade your qualification from a Diploma of Early Childhood Education and Care within two years of full-time study. If you have a three-year early childhood teaching degree, you can be qualified in one year of full-time study.

Designed by leading educators to meet the demand for high-quality early childhood teachers, this degree allows you to study for a nationally accredited qualification while continuing to work in your early childhood service.

Bachelor of Education (Early Childhood and Primary)

This course enables you to support, engage and teach young children in their most formative years. Become qualified to educate children from birth to 12 years as an early childhood and primary school teacher and make a real difference.

If your passion is to work with children to shape their physical, emotional and cognitive development, you enjoy working with families and you also want to be an integral part of the community, then our Bachelor of Education (Early Childhood and Primary) is for you. This accredited degree allows you to teach nationally and is internationally recognised.

Bachelor of Education (K-12)

If you love learning, enjoy adding value to the community and want to make a positive difference in students' lives from Kindergarten to Year 12, this course is for you. The Bachelor of Education (K-12) is a dual-sector qualification, giving you the opportunity to become a teacher with the skills and knowledge to teach in primary and secondary schools.

You'll study a combination of on-campus and online subjects, and have the opportunity to engage with schools from your second year of study. Workplace learning opportunities will allow you to gain practical experience across primary and secondary settings. This accredited degree allows you to teach across Australia and is internationally recognised.

Bachelor of Education (Technology and Applied Studies)

There's high demand for teachers qualified in technology and applied studies. In this course, you'll learn how to teach design and technology with the opportunity to select and develop skills and knowledge from a broad range of technology fields.

This four-year degree offers flexibility while 80 days of professional experience placement ensures you are job-ready when you graduate.

The course is delivered online with a number of intensive schools in Wagga Wagga. Depending on what teaching area you are interested in, there is opportunity for blended learning through a combination of online and on-campus study.

If you're a School Learning Support Officer (SLSO), this course can take your career to the next level as you become a qualified teacher.

Our Bachelor of Educational Studies is a pathway to the Master of Teaching (Primary) or Master of Teaching (Secondary) and will allow you to become an accredited primary or secondary teacher in just four years of full-time study.

Courses

Bachelor of Education (Secondary) Industry Entry

Are you an industry expert seeking to share your knowledge with the next generation? The Bachelor of Education (Secondary) Industry Entry will prepare you for a rewarding career as a teacher. You'll specialise in a secondary school discipline related to your experience in your trade, such as plumbing, carpentry, fitting, electrical, hospitality, automotive, food technology or information technology. And you'll put your skills into action on professional placements. If you're transitioning from Defence to civilian life, this course lets you practise what you are passionate about and start your next career.

Offered online, this education degree has a number of short intensive schools in Wagga Wagga, depending on what teaching area you choose. It provides flexibility and access for those from an industry background looking to venture into teacher education. You could be eligible for significant credit – up to one-third of the degree – enabling you to complete the degree in as little as 2.5 years of full-time study.

If you have 16 previous university subjects with two in the teaching area you wish to study, you can also begin this course with a generous credit package and study English, Maths, Science or HSIE.

Ready to change careers and become a primary school teacher? Our online Master of Teaching (Primary) is ideal if you have an undergraduate degree in another discipline and want to fast-track to a teaching qualification.

Learn how to teach children aged five to 12 and help them develop the knowledge, skills and dispositions to provide the best possible start in life. Work placements can be done in your community or Australia-wide – so you can get practical experience in the communities you want to work in.

These courses provide flexibility to gain a teaching degree in two years full-time or four years of part-time study.

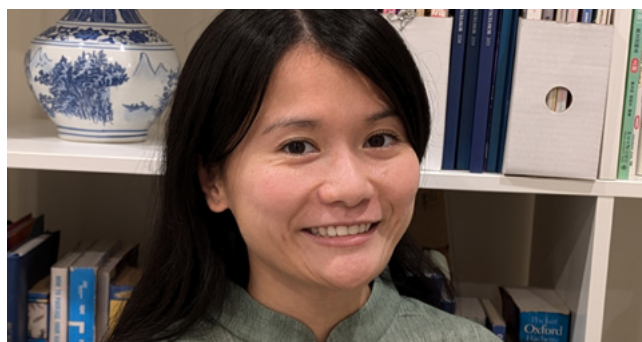
Master of Teaching (Secondary)

Thinking of starting your next career as a high school teacher? Our online Master of Teaching (Secondary) is ideal if you have an undergraduate degree in another discipline and want to become a secondary teacher. Depending on your qualifications, you may need to complete additional study to meet subject requirements.

You'll be qualified to teach one or more subjects to secondary students and support their social, emotional, intellectual and physical development.

These degrees provides flexibility to gain a teaching degree in two years of full-time or four years of part-time study.

Teacher's aide program

Bachelor of Educational Studies, Master of Teaching (Primary) or Master of Teaching (Secondary)

Make your next career move as a qualified teacher. If you're a teacher's aide, school learning support officer or Aboriginal education officer, you can become a fully qualified teacher in as little as three years with our pathway program.

First, enrol in the Bachelor of Educational Studies. You can complete your qualification in as little as two years while you continue to work – and get credit for previous related study.

Next, enrol in the Master of Teaching (Primary) or Master of Teaching (Secondary) where you'll specialise in the same learning area as your bachelor's. Complete your master's in as little as one year of full-time study!

Bachelor of Educational Studies

If you're currently teaching in secondary school and want to gain accreditation as a primary teacher, you can enrol in this course and complete only the subjects you need to gain accreditation.

This course also enables primary teachers to gain accreditation to teach secondary school – again, you need only complete the required number of subjects in this course to achieve accreditation.

The number of required subjects will vary from person to person; however, a secondary teacher moving to primary will study approximately seven subjects, and a primary teacher moving to secondary will study between seven and ten subjects (though it is often less than seven).

We will provide you with an individual study pattern, which may mean you can gain additional qualifications without completing the course.

Associate Degree in Adult and Vocational Education

Adult Literacy and Numeracy

Do you already have technical or vocational qualifications? Our Associate Degree in Adult and Vocational Education, with an Adult Literacy and Numeracy major, is an entry-level course that prepares you to teach in adult and vocational settings with a focus on literacy and numeracy programs. You'll learn to support the literacy and numeracy needs of students. Delivered fully online, the course offers flexibility to balance study with work and personal commitments anywhere in Australia.

Vocational Education and Training

Do you have technical or vocational qualifications? This major helps you teach in adult and vocational settings and provides a higher level of teaching knowledge than the Certificate IV in Training and Assessment. Recognised under the RTO Credentials Policy as a higher qualification, it is delivered fully online for flexible study.

Bachelor of Adult and Vocational Education (with specialisations)

This course considers your professional experience and qualifications and offers an attractive entry-level credit package, making it an efficient way to achieve a bachelor's degree. You can use your Certificate III or IV, your part or full apprenticeship, an associate diploma, or your industry experience to gain entry. Completing this degree also fulfils vocational trainers' and educators' professional development requirements.

Courses

Master of Education (with specialisations)

Our Master of Education will help you advance your career in leadership roles or specialise in a particular aspect of education. Our course has the range and flexibility to meet your specific interests and provide you with the knowledge and skills to address today's complex education challenges. Offered completely online over two sessions, you'll have the flexibility and support to study when and where it suits you.

You could choose to graduate with the Master of Education or specialise in educational leadership.

Educational Leadership

This specialisation focuses on theories of educational leadership and their purpose in 21st-century education. Further enhance your skills to drive positive outcomes for students, your workplace and your community.

Master of Inclusive Education

If you want to be a highly skilled inclusive education specialist and agent for change in your workplace, this course is for you.

It is designed for teachers who want to specialise in inclusive education and for people with qualifications in human development services including nursing, occupational therapy, physiotherapy, psychology and speech pathology.

You'll develop the core knowledge and skills required to teach, consult, collaborate, advocate and evaluate in an inclusive service delivery model.

This course covers international and Australian theory as well as best practice in the field of inclusion. You can study the graduate certificate as a standalone course or progress to complete your master's.

There is also Commonwealth supported places available – meaning you could save on your course!

If you're currently teaching at a primary or secondary school and you'd like to retrain and focus on another teaching area or stage, we have the ideal pathway for you. This course is also a pathway if you are currently a teacher's aide or School Learning Support Officer (SLSO) and wish to become a qualified primary or secondary teacher.

Bachelor of Educational Studies

If you're currently teaching in secondary school and want to gain accreditation as a primary teacher, you can enrol in this course and complete only the subjects you need to gain accreditation.

This course also enables primary teachers to gain accreditation to teach secondary school – again you need only complete the required number of subjects in this course to achieve accreditation.

The number of required subjects will vary. A secondary teacher moving to primary will study approximately seven subjects, and a primary teacher moving to secondary will study between seven to ten subjects (though it is often less than seven).
